## LANGUAGES CANADA STATISTICS

- 6 of our 226 member programs in the province, 5 from the public sector and 1 from the private sector
- 1,494 students enrolled in Languages Canada programs in 2015, which represented:
  - an estimated \$5,500,000 in tuition revenue alone
  - an estimated \$12,000,000 in overall revenue for the province

ECAP<sup>™</sup> assures that every student registered at a Languages Canada member program will be able to complete their studies. In case of school closure, students are transferred into a member program at no additional cost.

### Student Education Assurance Fund<sup>™</sup> (SEAF<sup>™</sup>)

Funds from SEAF<sup>™</sup> would be used to reimburse students who cannot complete their studies in the event placement is not possible.

### By-laws, Membership Policies and Code of Conduct

By-laws and related membership policies including Code of Conduct provide the guiding principles for members of Languages Canada. Members not meeting criteria including standards may lose membership.
